Question 6: "What does the bursary cover?"

Answer: Tomorrow Trust provides comprehensive bursary support, which includes covering costs of the full university fees, accommodation allowance, a living allowance, textbooks, and equipment, and a laptop. In addition to the necessity, Tomorrow Trust provides a unique service to its students. Students are provided much-needed one-on-one monthly psychosocial support that focuses on mental well-being, academic coaching, career guidance and a general sounding board. Students are also signed up for our monthly specialised holistic workshops that focus on critical topics that would set them apart in the working world and in life.

Question 7: "Can I stay off campus if I am accepted?"

Answer: Yes, we cover both on-campus and off-campus accommodation.

Question 8: "When do I receive my living stipend?"

Answer: Student receives their stipends on the 25th of each month.
